Session 1: Preparing the final Assembly vision: creating elements of the vision based on areas of consensus

Members will be shown a short video explaining the vision process

Jam-boards have been created by the Secretariat on each of the areas of consensus from weekend 5. The jam-boards bring together relevant material from your 22 and 67 statements (weekend 2), the Covid recall list and commentary on areas of consensus (weekend 5). Each group will consider what is at the heart of the area of consensus and draft an element of the vision in respect of that area of consensus. That element will then be reviewed by two other groups who will discuss and propose amendments if desired.

Outputs to be achieved:

Draft elements of the vision statement from each group and any possible alternative text from the rotation groups

Session 2: Finalising the Vision: final review of work from the morning and voting

The draft elements of the vision statement will be returned to the original group together with any proposed amendments by review groups. At this stage the original group can choose to accept any proposed amendments or retain the original draft.

Members will then vote on each element of the vision statement. There will be two rounds of voting, the first to decide between any alternative drafts of elements prepared by the original and reviewing groups. The second will be on each element in turn to decide if it should be included as part of the final vision of the Assembly. Only those which are agreed by consensus will be included.

These votes will be done using Survey Monkey, a link to the vote will be given to you during the meeting.

There will then be a final vote for the Assembly to formally adopt the agreed vision.

Session 1: Recommendations - introduction and start of the process

Members will be shown a short video explaining the recommendations process

Members will work in small groups to consider the recommendations process and any questions they have. These questions will then be answered in plenary by the Convener and Design team. For any questions not answered in plenary, the Secretariat will subsequently respond and post this on the website.

Members will then return to their small groups to start drafting recommendations. By reviewing notes you produced on Saturday, and drawing on learning from other materials and discussions to date, members will begin to discuss recommendations that they want to develop in weekend 7.

Members will share the key points from their discussion shared with the whole group in plenary.

To help members to prepare their final conclusions and recommendations at weekend 7 the Secretariat will provide Explanatory Notes on each of the groups of recommendations. There will also be a series of workshops, in advance of



weekend 7, to introduce members to the material in the Explanatory Notes and to outline the next steps
