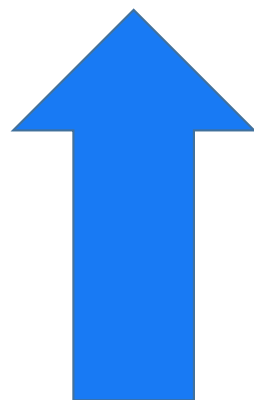

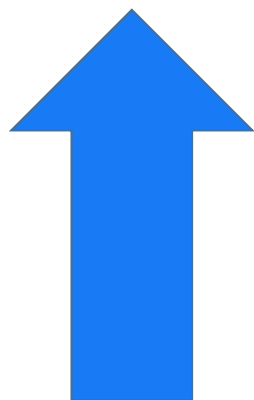

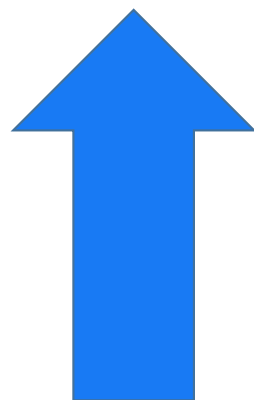

Area of Consensus - Sustainability



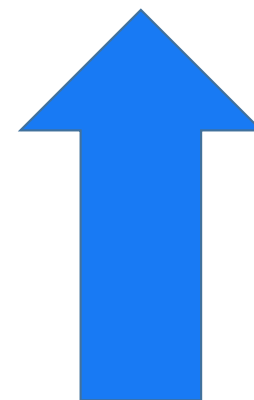

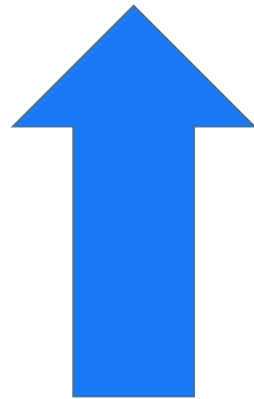

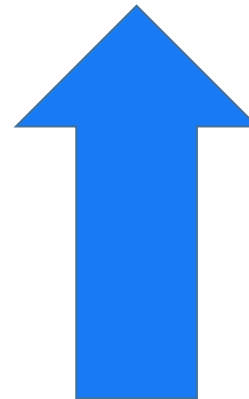

Areas of consensus

Covid reflections

Kindness, being caring and community minded important values

...be a safe country

Being socially responsible and taking care of the most vulnerable

...be more community minded

...be kind and thoughtful

Social isolation and wider mental health issues made worse and should be a priority for services and support.

support for the disabled and older generations affected by the pandemic

Next Steps - Vision Process

Key points to take into account when drafting an element of the vision statement – what is at the heart of the area of consensus?



Each group drafts an element of the vision statement



Review 1 – another group reviews the element of the vision statement

Review 2: a second group reviews the element of the vision statement



Final review - the element of the vision statement is returned to the original group



Members vote on the vision statement
